



Gigondas to produce white wines

Head of the Gigondas growers' syndicat Louis Barruol, who is also the **owner of Château de Saint Cosme**, said: 'We've been making whites for decades on this terroir, and not being able to call them Gigondas reflects a historical mistake. Now our Clairette on limestone will be able to sing using the right words.'

'For me there is a feeling of collective achievement, and today I think of our fathers who worked for this wonderful appellation before us with passion and selflessness.'

Anybody paying the slightest attention to Gigondas over the last three decades knows Château de Saint Cosme and Louis Barruol, who took control here in 1992. Barruol represents the 14th generation of his family to oversee the family's winery and 15 hectares of vineyard, almost all of them planted to Grenache. Those vines are extremely old, with many now 120 years of age, planted in the heart of the appellation. The wines are still made in the original cellar of the estate, which was constructed in the Gallo Roman era, over 2,000 years ago. So, history looms large here, quite literally as the 11th-century Chapelle Saint-Cosme et Saint-Damien sits directly above the winery and château. When it comes to wines, history is respected, with no rusticity in the way. In fact, these are consistently among the most skillfully and meticulously crafted wines in the Rhône valley. The standard of quality maintained by Barruol is as high as for any winery I know, anywhere. In recent years the domaine has issued what, for me, are the best wines ever, especially the 2020s. While the limited production, single-site bottlings are not easy to find and unquestionably expensive, the flagship Gigondas bottling is an excellent value and delivers more bang than plenty of Southern Rhône wines that sell for twice as much, or even more. And there's a good amount of it, some 50,000 bottles per vintage. Starting with the 2023 vintage, there will be an appellation Gigondas Blanc, a goal that Louis Barruol has been doggedly pursuing over two decades, often seemingly single-handedly.



Château de St.-Cosme winemaker Louis Barruol is well-known for his stunning Gigondas. His top Côtes du Rhône, Les Deux Albion, is sourced from vineyards in the Plan de Dieu, Saint-Maurice and Cairanne communes. It's made in the same way as his prestige wines, using **whole-cluster** co-fermentation (fermenting different grape varieties together) with **native yeasts** in concrete vats. Even his entry-level St.-Cosme Côtes du Rhône, made with purchased fruit, offers a taste of Barruol's uncompromising style at just \$21.

The Rhône Faces the Heat

Louis Barruol, who helms his family's ancient Château de St.-Cosme estate in Gigondas as well as Château de Rouanne in nearby Vinsobres, cites the impressive freshness of the 2020 vintage as evidence. "The vines have adapted to these hot, dry conditions," he says, explaining that they have learned how to protect themselves since the legendary scorching heat of 2003. "The 2020s are very balanced wines, with a nice amount of finesse."

Situated at the base of the Alps, Vinsobres' vineyards climb up to 1,700 feet in elevation. They are blasted by an even more powerful *mistral wind* and cooler temperatures than the rest of the Southern Rhône that slow ripening. The debut vintage of Barruol's Château de Rouanne was 2018, and the wines show the darker fruit profile and burlier tannins one expects from mountain wines.

Propriétaire du Château de Saint Cosme à Gigondas et négociant, Louis Barruol a fait l'acquisition du Château de Rouanne à Vinsobres.

« C'est un joli domaine de 62 hectares d'un seul tenant, chose très rare. Il y a 42 hectares de vignes en appellation Vinsobres, 14 en Côtes du Rhône et 8 en IGP Méditerranée « Comté de Grignan ». Ces derniers sont sur des sols calcaires, idéaux pour vinifier un brut nature, un effervescent sec traditionnellement réalisé sur ce secteur. C'est un grand terroir, avec de superbes argiles rouges du Pliocène apportant de la texture, de la complexité, un haut pedigree ! », explique le nouveau propriétaire.



Exclusive: St.-Cosme's Louis Barruol Purchases Vinsobres Estate in Southern Rhône

Louis Barruol, owner and vigneron of Château de St.-Cosme in France's Gigondas appellation, has purchased the Château de Rouanne estate in neighboring Vinsobres. The historic estate totals 177 acres, including 153 acres of vines, along with a cellar and buildings dating to the early 19th century. The property borders domaines Chaume-Arnaud, Jaume and Coriançon. The purchase price was not disclosed.

"It reminds me a lot of St.-Cosme when I took over in 1992," Barruol told *Wine Spectator*. "It's an unknown sleeping beauty waiting for a vigneron to truly love it."

Among the best-value wines produced in New York, the Classique Riesling from Forge is elegant and accessible, with charming, concentrated floral and stone fruit notes on the nose. While it does not have the thrilling tension of the single-vineyard bottlings, there is finesse to spare, and the finish lingers pleasantly on the palate. The process starts with tank-fermenting all the odd lots that don't fit into barrels and adding barrels from the single-vineyard bottlings to complete the requisite volume. The result is consistently superb.



Delicious. From the Caywood Vineyard, planted in the 1970s, this wine offers depth, complexity, and vibrancy. Aromatics are classic, petrol, gunpowder minerality, and ripe stone fruits carry through. The palate is rich, with ripe pear and peach flavours, and some saline characters intermingle with beeswax and fresh lime. There is a finish that seems to go on forever.

A Frenchman In New York: Louis Barruol From Gigondas Goes To Finger Lakes To Make Wine

We've tasted a few riesling wines from Forge Cellars. They all have a magnificent acidity which sometimes reaches 7 grams per litre. The alcohol content is 12.5-13%. They are all bone dry with a sugar content of 0.5-2.5 g/l. These are wines for people, for instance, me, who love the really dry, crispy, steely, fresh style of riesling.

Einen besonderen Stellenwert nimmt der Single-Vineyard-Ansatz bei den von Louis Barruol (Château Saint-Cosme in Gigondas) und Rick Rainey gegründeten Forge Cellars ein. Jedes Jahr füllen sie ein Dutzend Single Vineyard Bone Dry Riesling ab, jeder mit eigenem Profil – ein Beweis für die Vielfalt der Terroirs am Seneca Lake. Riesling Classique und Pinot Noir Classique sind international die eigentlichen Botschafter des Weinguts und zugleich für das Cool Climate der Finger Lakes.
