Ripe berry coulis on the nose with a ferrous tang. Full-bodied, very ripe and potent, with intense, concentrated fruit and warming alcohol on the finish. It does has a sense of freshness at its core however, and chalky tannins like 100% cacao dark chocolate. Drinking Window 2021 - 2024

#### Jeb Dunnuck

Château de Rouanne Vinsobres Rating: 90

Looking at the reds, the 2019 Vinsobres is unquestionably outstanding and has lots of Syrah character in its dark, meaty fruits, peppery herb, violet, and chalky mineral-like aromas and flavors. Oil. The wines come in a solid shape, and can show full, robust qualities.

The first big quality strike under the new owner came with the 2019, a \*\*\*\*(\*) wine of rolling depth, very long.
