
## Introduction

Tasting your way through hundreds of wines in order to get a feel for a vintage is a bit like watching the flight of starlings. There are always some smaller groups doing their own thing, but as you observe one by one, you can gradually paint a picture of the flock and where it's going; each year there is a degree of synchronicity. So what of the 2013 Rhônes?

If the Southern Rhône narrowly had the edge in 2012, it's the Northern Rhône that flies higher in 2013. In some cases much higher; some very good reds were made in 2013 and some excellent whites. But volumes are low. They are down even further in the Southern Rhône, but here the picture is a little sketchier; it's a vintage whose character has been sharply jolted by climatic conditions. Some have styled it out and made some excellent wines; others fell over and had trouble picking themselves up.

In last year's report, the wines were categorised into Northern Rhône and Southern Rhône. This year, there are three categories; Northern Rhône, Châteauneuf-du-Pape and Other Côtes-du-Rhône. This should help shine a light on some Southern Rhône appellations and villages that offer excellent quality and value but are sometimes in the shadow of the Châteauneuf mothership.

I've sifted through over 1,000 different wines to produce this report. It points out those who have really stood out in the 2013 vintage. I hope it leads you to some smart purchases.

# The 10 things you need to know about 2013 in the Rhône

Whilst 2013 was a troublesome vintage in much of France it turned out to be largely pretty good in the Rhône. But trying to generalise about a vintage across the Northern and Southern

Rhône only ever makes any sense in the very best or very worst of vintages, and 2013 is neither of these. In the North it is good to very good; in the South, in quality terms if not character, it is average to good. But despite the challenges, some estates in the South made very good wines.

On raising the subject of the 2013 vintage with winemakers in the Southern Rhône, the first word

you will hear is coulure. This is the failure of grape clusters to form properly after flowering, and is usually caused by adverse climatic events during flowering – in this case unseasonably cold, wet spring weather. It's not a disease, and doesn't cause any residual flavour defects in the grapes like rot can, but it affects yields. Some varieties are more susceptible than others, and Grenache is one of them (not just the Grenache Noir, but also Blanc and Gris.) A loss of 20% to 30% of the crop is commonplace; some estates report losses of 70% or more. There may not have been much Grenache this vintage, but the quality of the remaining fruit was good.

Yields are the most obvious way that coulure has affected the 2013 vintage, but not the only one. It means that many of the red blends in

the Southern Rhône have been bulked out by Syrah and Mourvèdre which has resulted in some atypical wines; fortunately both of these secondary varieties performed well this year. Stylistically this means that some wines are a little more structured and have a touch more black fruit character; not always a bad thing.



Since both Syrah and Mourvèdre ripen at lower alcohol levels it means that the wines are often

less alcoholic. The gradual increase of alcohol levels in the Southern Rhône is a common complaint amongst wine lovers. If the 2013s are welcomed by drinkers, I suspect we'll see an increase in plantings of Mourvèdre. Alcohol levels, though rarely a big issue in the Northern Rhône, are also relatively low this year with many wines around the 13% mark.



The cold weather at flowering also affected both red and white varieties in the Northern Rhône,

though not to the same extent. It hit the whites harder than the reds, so volumes are down significantly. This is a real shame, since otherwise this was a very good to exceptional vintage for Northern Rhône whites, particularly St Péray, St Joseph and Condrieu. The long growing season has given the Condrieus freshness, acidity, concentration and moderate alcohol levels. Condrieu can be capricious, but 2013 reminds us that it can be one of the greatest of white wines when conditions work in its favour.

This is also a good year for whites in the Southern Rhône, particularly in Châteauneuf and Cairanne and to some extent Lirac. The best display a delicious balance of concentration, freshness and acidity.

Red appellations in the Northern Rhône that have done well are Cornas, St Joseph and there is some excellent Cote-Rôtie. Crozes-Hermitage and even the less favoured sites in Hermitage have performed less convincingly. Outside of Châteauneuf, the Southern Rhône has performed well in Gigondas, Vacqueyras, Cairanne and Lirac. Deficiencies in underperforming wines were often linked to ripeness; either lacking generosity of fruit or concealing green, astringent tannins.

The wines display a clear stamp of terroir across the region. The growing cycle was three weeks late in getting started and it never really caught up, ending up in a very late harvest. This long, slow growing

season has resulted in good freshness in the wines (and sometimes quite pronounced acidity). Certainly no over-ripeness – what Jean-Louis Chave refers to as "one of the masks of terroir."

This is not a vintage for longterm ageing of reds. This is a vintage to buy the best wines with care and to enjoy them fairly young and fresh. Only the very best wines of Cornas, Hermitage and Côte-Rôtie will be worth squirreling away for long periods of time.

Though quantities are down, on the whole prices are steady. There is still plenty of value to be had in the Rhône, from North to South, from basic to prestige, in reds and in whites.

# About the tastings and scores

The resulting lists of recommended wines have been distilled from a number of tastings between July and November 2014. I spent two weeks in the Rhône in July/August visiting domaines and speaking to winemakers. Then a further week and a half in October/November for more visits and daily tastings of collated samples, organised by village or appellation, of approximately 100 wines per day. I also attended tastings in London organised by various UK importers.

Most of the whites were finished and in bottle. The majority of the reds however were either tank or barrel samples. The scores for these in particular are only to be taken as an approximation. A wine can change a great deal between barrel and bottle, particularly when the final blend is yet to be decided. Where wines are unfinished, it also means that some don't have precise details on final blends or alcohol levels.

Unlike Burgundy and Bordeaux, there is no dedicated period that the UK wine trade concentrates on the Rhône. Some offers are released in November (Justerini & Brooks, H2Vin, Goedhuis) and some in February/ March (Berry Brothers & Rudd, OW Loeb, Lay & Wheeler, Charles Taylor, Ten Acre Wines, Jeroboams). So some of the wines in this report are available at the time of publication, some will be offered later, and others will simply come onto the market as vintages sell through.

This makes it difficult to give stockists and prices for all the wines. Where current UK suppliers and prices are available, they are quoted. If the wine isn't yet on the market, I've used Wine Searcher pricing as a guide; either average prices across all vintages or by using a comparable vintage if this is more accurate. Where I couldn't find a stockist I've quoted retailers who stock previous vintages (or other wines by the same producer) or the producer's importer or agent; they should at least be able to guide you if they don't plan to offer the 2013s. In the rare occasion I've recommended the first vintage of a wine and it's not yet on the market, no price is given.

Rather than a list of top scoring wines, this report is intended to serve as a guide to wines that merit particular attention. It is designed to cater for different tastes and a range of budgets, and to cover a varied selection of producers and appellations. In total I tasted over 1,000 wines but it's impossible to taste at every domaine, and some producers such as Domaine Georges Vernay never show unfinished wines from barrel. Notable absences this year are: Château Grillet, Gerin, Gangloff, Allemand, Vieille Julienne and the top cuvées of Jaboulet, Beaucastel, Pegaü, la Barroche, Mas de Boislauzon and Clos St Jean... I'll try to fit them in next year.

## Tasting notes

## Top 50 Northern Rhône Reds



#### Domaine Jamet Côte-Rôtie Côte Brune

100% Syrah, BIB, £2,916.00 AWSP

90% whole bunches. Plenty of blackberry aromas here - the fruit and the bush. Brimming with violets and black pepper and some bergamot and orange peel aromas in the background. Very fragrant. Some raspberry fruit too on the palate. Very expressive and detailed. The wine is packed full of dense tannin, but all fully ripe and velour textured. A complete wine with weight, elegance and length. There is a wonderfully wild and almost rustic element to Jamet's Côte-Rôties that delivers an extraordinary level of complexity. 2023 to 2040.



#### Domaine René Rostaing Côte-Rôtie La Landonne

100% Syrah, J&B, £895.00

Wonderful aromatics here, fresh blackberry fruit, sticky duck jus, black pepper and herbs. Dense and juicy with an imposing structure. Lovely concentration and firm, ripe tannin. Long. This is serious stuff, very savoury and herbal with the guts to last. 2018 to 2030.



#### Domaine Jean Louis Chave Hermitage

100% Syrah, YAP, £1,740.00 AWSP

A tasting of the principal component lieu-dits: La Beaume, Les Bessards, L'Ermite, Le Méal and Péléat. For Jean-Louis, 2013 is "a mystery; a difficult year that has delivered great wines" and this is reflected in the tasting. The wines aren't huge and powerful in 2013, but they have considerable finesse in fruit and tannin, with great verve, freshness and balance. His 2013 Hermitage will be well-defined, detailed and unmistakably Hermitage. 2020 to 2043.



#### Domaine E. Guigal Côte-Rôtie La Landonne

100% Syrah, JEF, £3,996.00 AWSP

42 months in 100% new oak. Distinctly spicy on the nose, alongside plenty of lifted violet and black pepper. Very Northern in character. Full-bodied, with intense concentration of fruit under the considerable oak veneer. The fruit is ripe, but not overly so, and retains a sense of freshness and crispness. Straight and long with a very fine lattice of ripe tannin. 2021 to 2039.



#### M. Chapoutier Hermitage Le Pavillon

100% Syrah, J&B, £1,330.00

65-year-old vines on granite from Les Bessards. Dark, deep, inky, blackcurrant nose. Very full-bodied, beautifully fine tannins here. Bright and fresh with a lovely texture. Long, pure and straight, wonderfully fruity and showing refreshingly low alcohol. Top class. 2020 to 2042.



#### Domaine Clape Cornas

100% Syrah, FRW, £874.00

A tasting of the four main components show very different wines, all with distinct personalities. Sweet and fleshy fruits imbedded in a robust tannin and acid structure from La Petite Côte. An animal, rustic, gruff La Sabarotte. La Côte has smoky herbal aromatics, density, body and presence. And Renards, which is always an absolute joy to taste and no less so in 2013, with a beautiful expression of fruit and remarkable finesse. The general impression is one of serious structure in 2013, and strongly typical Cornas character. 2021 to 2039.



#### Domaine Vincent Paris Cornas La Geynale

100% Syrah, 14.0%, THT, £360.00 AWSP

Very intense, you can practically see the aromas. Painfully young still. Incredible concentration. Tannins are supernaturally intense, like drinking a portcullis. Very long, and underneath the armour there is plenty of fresh fruit. The tannins are only just ripe enough, but they are ripe. Does it have enough fruit to last until the point the tannins soften? I think so, just. This isn't the richest Cornas, but will make for some incredible drinking when it's ready in nearly a decade's time. 2021 to 2039.



#### Domaine François Villard Côte-Rôtie Le Gallet Blanc

99% Syrah, 1% Viognier, H2V, £320.00

Closed for now, but with an intense core of fruit. Full-bodied and concentrated, powerful, but lifted, balanced and fresh. Acidity is in balance (even slightly on the low side, but not problematically so). Savoury nose, with black olive and pink peppercorn. Ripe blackberries. All shot through with plenty of ripe, smooth, fine tannin. Very long too. This is exactly what you would hope for from Villard. 2016 to 2027.



#### Domaine Bernard Faurie Hermitage Bessards Méal

100% Syrah, J&B, £450.00

60% Bessards, 40% Méal lieux-dits. Some raspberry and black cherry alongside the blackberry fruit, this is fuller than his Greffieux Bessards blend but still relatively mediumbodied and fleet of foot for a Hermitage. Fine but firm tannins and plenty of acidity in 2013. Understated power. Bernard plans to retire after the 2015 vintage, which is a great pity as he makes an outlying but uniquely fine and elegant style of Hermitage. 2015 to 2022.



#### Domaine Pierre Gonon St Joseph

100% Syrah, 13.0%, VNT, £360.00 AWSP

Blueberries, blackberries, plums and cedar, tobacco and vanilla. Full-bodied, gorgeous, lush, intensity of fruit. Plenty of acidity, this is savoury but the fruit is perfectly ripe - just on the perfect point. Very long and perfectly balanced. Wonderfully fresh, with complexity already developing. Amazing clarity and definition of fruit. The Gonon brothers somehow manage to imbue their wines with a feeling of effortlessness and authenticity you rarely see elsewhere in St Joseph. 2015 to 2022.



#### Domaine Niero Côte-Rôtie Eminence

95% Syrah, 5% Viognier, 13.0%, BBR, £324.00 AWSP

Fine, fresh fragrance, ripe fruits; loganberry, pine needles, and a touch of resin on the nose. Medium to full with no heaviness. Good concentration, very elegant, with purity and length of flavour. Ready now, very Burgundian in style. All the elements are there, and all in balance. Very well done indeed. 2015 to 2024.



#### Domaine Marc Sorrel Hermitage Le Gréal

92% Syrah, 8% Marsanne, BBR, £840.00 AWSP

90% Le Méal and 10% Les Greffieux lieu-dits (hence the name). 60-year-old vines on average, 100% whole bunches. Dark in colour, deep and brooding blackberry with a touch of camphor and liquorice. Ripe fruits on the palate, and plenty of ripe tannins. Serious concentration and very long, this is a powerful wine that makes a real physical impression. This will be very impressive given time. 2021 to 2035.



#### Domaine Clusel-Roch Côte-Rôtie Grandes Places

100% Syrah, J&B, £575.00

Very tightly wound, warm spices just about peeping out. Concentrated and savoury, tannins a little grainier here for now, but will mellow. Very long. Lots of extract, really coats the mouth. Long term. 2019 to 2033.



#### Domaine Coursodon St Joseph Le Paradis Saint Pierre

100% Syrah, 13.5%, BBR, £336.00 AWSP

The nose promises a lot, but it's all very tightly wound at the time of tasting. Full-bodied, tons of intense fruit. Powerful, but really fresh and lively. Wonderful acidity and minerality on the finish. Tannins run through it like a grid, they are plentiful but very ripe. Very long. Perfectly balanced. And just 13.5% ABV. This is a brilliant wine. 2016 to 2023.



#### Domaine Eric & Joël Durand Cornas Confidence

100% Syrah, 13.0%, BBR, £402.00 AWSP

Violets, liquorice and fresh blackberries can just about be coaxed out of this superdense black hole of a wine. Very full-bodied, but fresh, with incredibly fine tannin, and ripe, impressively dense fruit. A pure, polished and modern expression of Cornas, but the oak use is balanced. All very vibrant and fresh. Very long and very impressive. 2020 to 2040.



#### **Domaine Vincent Paris Cornas Granit 60**

100% Syrah, 13.0%, THT, £324.00 AWSP

More tightly wound, more savoury and darker in fruit character than his Granit 30, which in itself is a very good wine. Some black pepper. Full-bodied, very rich and intense, all encased in a crunchy lattice of tannin. Very long, with balanced acidity. Serious stuff, very intense, but not without freshness and detail. You'll need patience though. 2020 to 2029.



#### Domaine Duclaux Côte-Rôtie Maison Rouge

100% Syrah, 13.0%, VNT, £564.00 AWSP

Very dry and austere palate, thick with coating tannin and matter. Exceptionally tight and closed, very hard to coax anything out of it at the time of tasting. But the tannins are ripe and plentiful, the acid is balanced, there is concentration and energy. This wine may prove to be exceptional - time will tell. 2017 to 2025.



#### Domaine Christophe Pichon Côte-Rôtie Promesse

90% Syrah, 10% Viognier, 12.5%, BBR, £308.00 AWSP

Very floral, very fruity, with noticeable oak for now but lots of highly aromatic Syrah fruit behind it. Sweet fruit on the palate, with plenty of detail already. Highly aromatic, ethereal, with good concentration of fruit, ripe tannin and good length: lots to enjoy here. A distinctly hedonistic and crowd-pleasing wine. 2015 to 2024.



#### Domaine Mouton Côte-Rôtie

100% Syrah, 13.0%, BBR, £550.00 AWSP

Perfumed, very much red fruit in character. Medium-bodied with good concentration of fruit. Acid is quite pronounced, good energy and length. Bright and fresh, elegant, very smooth in texture with suave tannins. 2015 to 2023.



#### Domaine Alain Voge Cornas Vieilles Vignes

100% Syrah, 13.5%, GDH, £350.00

Very smoky. Struck flint, hard and mean like Clint Eastwood. Full-bodied, rich, ripe, lovely interwoven ripe tannins. Firm acids, firm finish. Good length. This will be wonderful when it's ready. 2017 to 2026.



#### Domaine du Colombier Hermitage

100% Syrah, 13.5%, GDH, £396.00

Deep, inviting nose. Lovely depth and ripeness of fruit with some star anise. Great presense. Very intense and concentrated, very long. Acid is balanced, and tannin although hefty is ripe and balanced. Very smooth in texture, tailored and crafted. Mineral finish. This will age well. 2016 to 2031.



#### Domaine Franck Balthazar Cornas Chaillot

100% Syrah, SVS, £288.00 AWSP

100% whole bunches. Deep and very expressive nose of garrigue herbs, blackberry and damson. It has the tannic structure expected of a Cornas along with a savoury dry finish but what really marks it out is the lush fruit on the mid palate and an overall lively, approachable, drinkable style. Not hugely concentrated, but good freshness and well balanced. 2015 to 2025.



#### Delas Frères Côte-Rôtie La Landonne

100% Syrah, BWS, £1,284.00 AWSP

Better than their Seigneur de Maugiron, more convincing aromatics and structure. Mediumbodied, lovely smooth texture, balanced acid and oak treatment. A touch of salinity and warm spices on the finish. Pure and long. 2015 to 2020.



#### Domaine René Rostaing Côte-Rôtie Ampodium

100% Syrah, J&B, £430.00

Clear, defined, spicy aromatics: black pepper, violets, very classic, quite intense. Medium to full with keen acidity, and some slightly grainy tannins, but these will soften with further oak ageing. Firm, intense and very fresh. 2016 to 2020.



#### M. Chapoutier St Joseph Le Clos

100% Syrah, FFW, £480.00

15-year-old vines on granitic soil. Dense, deep and intense. Very full, with coating tannins but good freshness. Some lovely expressive peppery Rhône Syrah fragrance on the nose, backed up by serious intensity on the palate. Very long, rich and ripe. 2016 to 2025.



#### Domaine Coursodon St Joseph L'Olivaie

100% Syrah, 13.5%, CTW, £288.00 AWSP

More savoury than the Silice, this has plenty of garrigue herbs, small black olives and a touch of pork crackling. Full-bodied, tons of fresh blackberry fruit on the palate. All balanced with good acidity and a hint of oak in the background. Long, juicy and very satisfying. A very good St Joseph, with lots to enjoy. 2015 to 2020.



#### M. Chapoutier St Joseph Les Granilites

100% Syrah, MTZ, £228.00 AWSP

Medium to full-bodied, with a good core of blackberry fruit and a squeeze of raspberry freshness. Tannins are plentiful and ripe. Finish is long, straight and deep. Some blueberry and plum on the nose too. This is very good, very fresh, and all in good balance. Powerful but restrained. Impressive stuff. 2016 to 2022.



#### Domaine Eric & Joël Durand Cornas Empreintes

Exceptionally fine-grained tannins, very ripe and very smooth. Lovely slick of black fruits underneath: plum skin, ripe blackberries, some cassis even, all very well polished and pure. #### Domaine François Villard St Joseph Mairlant

100% Syrah, H2V, £165.00

Bergamot and citrus oils under layers of black fruit and lifted floral aromatics. Medium to full-bodied. Some serious fruit and layer upon layer of superfine ripe tannin all holding it down. Good length, and a savoury, satisfying, finish with a little spicy kick. Perfectly balanced, a complete wine. 2015 to 2022.



#### Delas Frères Cornas Chante Perdrix

100% Syrah, BWS, £264.00 AWSP

Smooth texture, lovely freshness and purity to the fruit. Very tannic, but they are ripe and integrated. Juicy blackberry and blackcurrant fruit. Long, ripe finish. Perhaps not the most complex, but very good. A smoky, spicy Cornas. 2016 to 2024.



#### Domaines Paul Jaboulet Aîné St Joseph La Croix des Vignes

#### Domaine du Coulet Cornas Les Billes Noires

Very high-toned, gorgeous nose of flowers and spice. Fresh earth too. Medium to full-bodied, very vibrant and intense. Strawberry, raspberry, cherry, black cherry and woody spices. Exceptionally fresh and juicy. Not long, but a really attention-grabbing experience. Clearly minimal intervention and low sulphur. 2015 to 2025.



#### Domaine Pierre Gaillard Côte-Rôtie Esprit de Blonde

Wonderful fragrance: black pepper, bacon fat and black cherry. Smoky. Rounded, medium body but with a good base of tannin. Good length and drive here. Oak is noticeable but well enough integrated. Nicely balanced, very well made, but this is a wine for those who value elegance and subtlety over power. 2015 to 2021.



#### Delas Frères St Joseph Sainte Epine

100% Syrah, BWS, £288.00 AWSP

Deep, intense, fleshy plum fruit, with crème de mure and a veneer of oak. Full-bodied, very smooth tannins. All completely ripe. A polished style, modern but not flamboyant, and the oak is balanced. #### Domaine du Colombier Crozes-Hermitage Cuvée Gaby

Brightly fruited, with bags of raspberry, blackberry and a hint of eucalyptus and pine, all brimming with life and electricity. So vibrant. Medium-bodied, with exceptionally finely grained ripe tannins. A brilliant expression of Crozes. 2015 to 2018.



#### Domaine Aléofane St Joseph

100% Syrah, 13.0%, ROB, £216.00 AWSP

Some discernible blackberry and blueberry fruit, savoury and dark fruited albeit fairly closed at the time of tasting. Smooth palate, ripe fruit and plenty of ripe tannin, showing good St Joseph character. All very harmonious and integrated, long and spicy; this is a serious wine, ambitious and successful. Nicely restrained use of oak. A remarkably intense wine for just 13% ABV. 2016 to 2021.



#### Domaine Eric & Joël Durand St Joseph Lautaret

100% Syrah, 13.0%, BBR, £216.00 AWSP

Very deeply tinted. Spicy, deep, savoury, with a hint of dark chocolate on the nose. Some juniper and plum sauce. Again, very flowing in texture, plenty of tannin, but just a little soft. A generous squeeze of acidity. These are very good St Josephs from Durand, but are more towards a ripe and yielding style rather than a solid, structural one. 2015 to 2020.



#### Domaine Emmanuel Darnaud St Joseph

100% Syrah, 13.0%, FMV, £300.00 AWSP

Chocolate covered black cherries and a whiff of charred meat. Lovely concentration of fruit and ripe tannins. Satisfying and juicy. Nicely judged, well balanced wine. 2015 to 2018.



#### Domaine Michelas-St-Jemms St Joseph Sainte Epine

100% Syrah, 13.0%, CTW, £156.00 AWSP

Lifted aromas of loganberry, damson and warm spices. Medium-bodied, but extremely fresh and lively, zinging fruit all shot through with live-wire acidity. Crackles. Perhaps just a little lacking in heft, but lots of fireworks to drink young. 2015 to 2018.

Bright cranberry and strawberry fruit with some underlying fresh mushroom aromas. Full-bodied, with a wonderfully soft texture despite a good heft of ripe tannin. It's an old-school, almost rustic style but vivid and intense. Long meaty, herbal finish. 2020 to 2040.



#### Clos des Papes Châteauneuf-du-Pape

Approximately 56% Grenache, 28% Mourvèdre, 11% Syrah, 5% others, 14.8%, UNC, £480.00 40% more Mourvèdre than a typical year, and 10% more Syrah to make up for the lack of Grenache. Tasting from a number of different foudres pre-assemblage promises a very good wine, though perhaps lacking the compelling brilliance of the 2012, in a more finely drawn, subtle style. Primarily red fruits on the nose; Victoria plum, raspberry and kirsch with a lovely soft texture and juicy acids. Fresh, balanced and elegant. 2015 to 2026.



#### Château Rayas Châteauneuf-du-Pape

#### Château de Beaucastel Châteauneuf-du-Pape

Princpally Mourvèdre, Grenache, Syrah and Counoise but all 13 varieties are used 14.5%, H2V, £420.00

Gorgeous nose, fresh and stewed Victoria plums, blueberries and violets. Full-bodied, very fresh and lively, dynamic and mineral. Juicy Mourvèdre fruit very much in evidence. Thick with ripe tannin. Mildly atypical for sure, very much on the dark fruit, but this will keep thanks to its intense concentration and depth. It's tannic for now - this needs and will repay medium to long-term ageing. #### Domaine de la Charbonnière Châteauneuf-du-Pape Mourre des Perdrix

65% Grenache, 18% Mourvèdre, 15% Syrah, 2% others, 15.5%, BBR, £276

From the lieu dit Mourre des Perdrix. Complex nose brimming with fruit: strawberry, raspberry, loganberry, blackberry, plum. All this alongside some well-integrated hints of smoke and incense. Intense and full-bodied, but no heaviness. Exceptionally well-balanced and harmonious already. Sits between modern and traditional style. Seriously good, a joyful wine. Domaine de la Charbonnière has really excelled in 2013. 2017 to 2027.



#### Domaine de la Janasse Châteauneuf-du-Pape Vieilles Vignes

80% Grenache, 10% Syrah, 10% Mourvèdre, 15.5%, ENO, £768.00 AWSP

Distinctly spicy and peppery compared to the Chaupin. Lilies and raspberries too. Sweet fruit on the attack, but then good acidity and weight of tannin comes in to give the wine depth and length. Good definition and detail, vibrant and lively, with a long finish. Really dynamic and refreshing, a joy to drink. 2017 to 2028.



#### Domaine Roger Sabon Châteauneuf-du-Pape Prestige

70% Grenache, 20% Syrah, 5% Mourvèdre, 5% Counoise/Vaccarèse, 15.0%, NYW, £312.00 AWSP

Liquorice, sloe and bay leaf. Intense fruit and freshness on the palate. Good weight of tannin and fine acidity - lovely balance and smooth, refined mouthfeel. An extraordinarily pure and very natural expression, it sings. 2015 to 2025.



#### Le Clos du Caillou Châteauneuf-du-Pape Réserve

75% Grenache, 25% Mourvèdre, 14.5%, H2V, £695.00

Mourvèdre to the fore with lovely aromatics of blueberries, lilies and a touch of fresh earth. Full-bodied and rich with wonderful intensity but no heaviness. Good acidity too. #### Château de Vaudieu Châteauneuf-du-Pape Val de Dieu

Beautifully lifted aromatics of predominantly red fruits and a spicy Syrah edge. Full, flowing, and weighty. #### Domaine Raymond Usseglio et Fils Châteauneuf-du-Pape Cuvée Impériale

Brooding, deep, black fruits - blackberries and black currant and damson. All shot through with high-toned floral and herbal overtones of rosemary and camphor. Full-bodied, but fresh and lively with lovely brisk acids. Real lift and aromatic brightness and freshness despite the high alcohol. Very well-crafted. Just 4,000 bottle produced. 2018 to 2028.



#### Domaine de la Charbonnière Châteauneuf-du-Pape Vieilles Vignes

90% Grenache, 10% Mourvèdre, 15.5%, BBR, £300.00

Plenty of strawberry Grenache fruit to enjoy with a background of herbs de Provence. Rich and juicy, with enough tannin here for the medium term but drinking well already. Splash of Mourvèdre really adds to it, giving it darkness, depth and length of fruit on the palate. The 2013s from Charbonnière are made with a lightness of touch, effortless harmony and balance. 2016 to 2027.



#### Domaine Charvin Châteauneuf-du-Pape

85% Grenache, 5% Syrah, 5% Mourvèdre, 5% Vaccarèse, 14.0%, C&B, £360.00 AWSP From the Cabrières lieu-dit. This is a highly recommended Châteauneuf for those who like a fresh, vivid style, but one with impact. It displays a lively, spicy, autumnal nose. Enough weight of fruit and ripe tannin, all ripe but not overly so, shot through with freshening

acidity. Perfect ripeness of fruit and good length. 2015 to 2022.



#### M. Chapoutier Châteauneuf-du-Pape Barbe Rac

100% Grenache, 14.5%, J&B, £400.00

Dark, brooding and spicy with a very full, voluptuous texture, lots of body and glycerol. Floral and black cherry top notes on the nose. Fruity, but with depth. Tannins are fine and sufficient to see it through to the medium term. As usual, Chapoutier's Barbe Rac cuvée has more richness and generosity than their Croix de Bois - and that's what's needed in this vintage. 2017 to 2026.



#### Clos du Caillou Châteauneuf-du-Pape Les Quartz

No 'Les Safres' made this year due to reduced quantities. Pure raspberry and strawberry fruit, outlined with clove, dark chocolate and rosemary. #### Vignobles Mayard Châteauneuf-du-Pape La Crau de ma Mère

Clear and fresh Victoria plum and strawberry aromas. Full-bodied and flowing but very lively though with good energy and tension. Ripe tannins tighten it up on the finish. #### Château Sixtine Châteauneuf-du-Pape

The oak is noticeable for now, but there is enough fruit and life here to swallow it in time. Bright and snappy red fruits with energy and life. 2016 to 2020.



#### Domaine Alary IGP Vaucluse L'Exclus

100% Counoise, 13.0%, H2V, £80.00

Aromatic cherry and raspberry fruit. Hint of pepper. Very lively and likeable juicy fruit on the palate. Medium length. Medium-bodied, fresh and drinkable. A very good 100% Counoise, and displays the potential for a grape we are likely to be seeing more and more of in the Southern Rhône. 2015 to 2017.

The resulting quality however is excellent, with just-ripe fruit and plenty of freshness, vigour and tension in the wines. The overall impression is a very good if relatively lean, mineral style in 2013, but not overly skinny, just slim. Likely to be very long lived. 2020 to 2043.



#### M. Chapoutier Hermitage L'Ermite

100% Marsanne, J&B, £2,220.00

100-year-old vines on the top of the hill of Hermitage behind the chapel on granitic soils. Deep gold, with an assertive earthy nose. Very full-bodied, very concentrated, with a firm mineral finish which holds the palate down. Keen, straight, very long. Great purity and intensity, with extraordinary length – it seems to block out your other senses when you taste it. Serious stuff. 2016 to 2038.



#### Domaine André Perret Condrieu Chéry

100% Viognier, GDH, £320.00

More fruit than Perret's basic Condrieu, and an incredible perfume; Dior would be proud. Very full and round, totally luxurious in the mouth but coupled with incredible freshness, bright acidity and somehow all ends feather-light, like a peck on the cheek. Very long. An incredible wine. 2015 to 2025.



#### Domaine Mouton Condrieu Côte Châtillon

100% Viognier, 14.0%, BBR, £440.00 AWSP

Lime blossom aromatics. Sublime freshness. Very long. An incisive, detailed and delineated style of Condrieu, one with great verve and line. Lovely acidity. Straight like an arrow, but with ample flesh. Very long finish. 2015 to 2020.



#### Domaine Niero Condrieu Chéry

100% Viognier, 14.5%, BBR, £336.00 AWSP

Hauntingly pure peach and apricot fruit. Very full and soft, a cherubic style of wine. Plenty of mouthwatering salty acidity on the finish and a nip of oak. Very long, suave and compelling, very persuasive. Long and rolling. Jasmine and peach juice. Utterly lovely. 2015 to 2028.



### **Domaine François Villard Condrieu Les Terrasses du Palat** 100% Viognier, 13.5%, H2V, £260.00

Very full, very lively. Amazing intensity and tension. Incredible, soaring Condrieu fruit but backed up with strict acidity and fresh minerality. Incredibly long. So big but so fresh.
