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Introduction

What is a great vintage?


For me, the first thing that springs to mind is a series of numbers. Numbers with haloes: '61, '78, '90, '05... For drinkers they are markers of bottles that have moved us, wines with the balance, power and longevity to casually smelt the passing years and yield the concentrated essence of a place. Wines that we covet. For winemakers they also act as an aide-memoire of the growing season. For great vintages the stories will be similar: ample heat and sun at the right times, no rain at the wrong times, late frosts and hail that didn't come at all. For Eric Boulet of Roucas Toumba in Vacqueyras "opening an older bottle is like opening a photo album."

So is 2014 a great vintage? With plentiful rain at the wrong times and a side order of hail, the answer is a resolute 'no'. But an ordinary vintage doesn't equate to uniformly ordinary wines. Some appellations will do better than others. Individual producers will outdo their neighbours. In great vintages everyone makes good wine; in difficult vintages there are winners and losers. First of all the winners must have the knowledge, energy and inclination to rise to the challenge. Secondly, they must have the means; significant manual labour was required in the vineyards to make a good wine in 2014.

When buying wines in middling years it can be wise to play it safe. Venerable estates with favourably positioned vineyards and a long-standing reputation for quality rarely disappoint. Even 2008, considered by many to be a below average vintage, resulted in thoroughly enjoyable wines from producers such as Clos des Papes, Domaine Jamet and Gourt de Mautens. Among the

very best estates, vintage is more often a longevity issue rather than a quality issue. But average years also serve to highlight talented producers who may be less renowned but who also strive for quality – estates that might offer better value for money than their more illustrious neighbours.

What isn't so brilliant about great vintages is that you have to wait until they're ready to drink. The last great vintage in the Rhône was 2010, and the more interesting wines are still far from ready. Most of the 2014s don't have the concentration and structure for the long haul, but they'll be ready to enjoy from release. This isn't a vintage for investors; it's a vintage for drinkers. Although it has its own unique imprint on the wines, the overall quality of the vintage is neither high nor low: in this sense it can be considered an average vintage. But when you consider the best wines of 2014 from a wider international perspective they are anything but average.



10 things

you need to know about the vintage

1

2014 wasn't an easy year for vigneronns in the Rhône. Those with favourable sites and the means to meet the challenges made good wines, though generally in a lighter style.

2

This is a growers' vintage; a huge amount of work was required in the vineyard to ensure a good result. The year started with a warm spring and early flowering, but July was cool and very wet. This led to multiple problems such as rot, dilution and a struggle for ripeness, particularly in vineyards where drainage is an issue. Although the weather improved dramatically in the second half of August there was rain again in mid-September in much of the Northern and the Southern Rhône when many were harvesting.

Another problem that vigneronns had to face in 2014 was *Drosophila suzukii*, the Asian fruit fly. It feeds on and lays its eggs in soft fruits such as grapes and was particularly prevalent in parts of the Rhône this year. Those affected had to sort their grapes with care or risk off flavours in their wines (a dirty, vinegary note).

Lightness and leanness are hallmarks of the vintage. Where the wines are balanced and – crucially – there is sufficient fruit and flesh, the wines are fresh and enjoyable with a certain diminutive athleticism and bright acidity that makes them enjoyably drinkable.

As such, this is not a year for long ageing. Most wines will be approachable on release and will age into the medium term at best.

In general, the vintage was more successful in the Northern Rhône than the Southern Rhône. Vineyards on slopes suffered less from the rains, as the water

runs off or drains away more readily. Appellations that performed the most consistently in the Northern Rhône were Saint-Joseph, Saint-Péray and Hermitage.

It was a very difficult year for Crozes-Hermitage, particularly those vineyards on the flatter southern part. Not only did they suffer from heavy rain, but they were also hit by hail; one producer described the summer as “catastrophic”. Another reported seeing “botrytis pretty much at veraison”. I tasted numerous wines that bordered on faulty. It's unwise to write off an entire appellation, but buy Crozes with care in 2014.

The rains also proved problematic in the Southern Rhône, and the results are mixed. The left bank had a particularly tough time. Lirac is often a go-to appellation for value reds, but many that I tasted were scrawny in 2014. Châteauneuf was badly affected by the rains, and although some very good wines were produced, some reds lack depth, concentration and structure. Cairanne, Rasteau, Vacqueyras and Gigondas were generally more consistent.

It may have been a challenging year for red wines, but 2014 is a good year for white wines throughout the Rhône. Hermitage and Saint-Péray in the north and Châteauneuf and Cairanne in the south in particular are appellations to look at. The best have clarity and definition of flavour, freshness and pinpoint acidity that will provide a lot of pleasure in their youth, and some into the medium term.

Winemakers couldn't contain their excitement about the 2015 vintage; I tasted a handful, and now I can't either. In all likelihood it will be a superlative year. It will almost certainly be a vintage in which to buy big, but you'll have to wait many years for them to be ready to drink.

About the tastings and scores

The following lists of recommended wines are the result of an extended two week visit to the Rhône at the end of October 2015. The majority were tasted in groups sorted by colour and appellation, and no more than 100 per day. This was supplemented by daily visits to taste from barrel and talk directly with winemakers in order to build up an understanding of the vintage. Further tastings held by various importers in London in November helped to complete the picture. Since not all of the wines could be tasted blind, none of the wines were tasted blind.

Most of the whites were finished and in bottle. Most of the reds were barrel or tank samples. Where the wines aren't yet finished, it's not always possible to give precise information on blends and final alcohol levels. With certain wines that were yet to be assembled, it was necessary to taste the separate components of the blend. This is mentioned in the tasting note, and the scores for these wines should be considered in light of this.

Unlike Burgundy and Bordeaux, there is no dedicated period that the UK wine trade concentrates on the Rhône. Some offers are released in November (Justerini & Brooks, H2Vin, Goedhuis) and some in February/March (Berry Brothers & Rudd, OW Loeb, Lay & Wheeler, Charles Taylor, Jeroboams). So some of the wines in this report are available at the time of publication, some will be offered later, and others (particularly the less expensive wines) will simply come onto the market as vintages sell through.

This makes it difficult to give stockists and prices for all the wines. Where the wine is

currently available on the UK market I've quoted a stockist and price. If the 2014 vintage is not yet available, I've quoted a stockist of a recent vintage that would be a good place to enquire about the 2014s. Where no vintage of the wine is available in the UK, I've quoted average Wine Searcher pricing across all other countries as a rough guide and a suggested stockist or importer to approach. A few wines have no guide price as they are either first vintages of new cuvées or there are no vintages of the wine available anywhere to compare pricing with.

What follows aren't simply lists of the top scoring wines; they are a selection of wines that I think are particularly worthy of your attention in 2014. It is designed to cater for different tastes across a range of budgets and appellations. Where producers make dozens of wines, it will be a selection of their best or most interesting cuvées. No individual can be entirely divorced from his or her personal likes and dislikes. To give you an idea of my palate: balance, harmony, elegance and drinkability are important to me; I'm particularly averse to unbalanced levels of alcohol, oak or sweetness.

In total I tasted nearly 1,000 wines from over 250 producers but inevitably some weren't available. Others such as Domaine Georges Vernay never show unfinished wines. Notable absences this year are Yves Gangloff, Henri Bonneau, Thierry Allemand, Raymond Usseglio, Vieille Julienne, Domaine Gonon, Gourt de Mautens, Clos St Jean, Stéphane Ogier and Château Grillet... I'll try to fit them in next year.

Tasting notes

Top 50 Northern Rhône Reds

97

Domaine JP&C Jamet Côte-Rôtie Côte Brune

100% Syrah, FRW £2,736.00 (2012)

No destemming. 20-25% new oak. His Côte Brune was once 50% of production when his father first started bottling it in 1966, but after much vineyard acquisition by Jean-Paul over the years, it is now a small proportion of production (just 2,000 bottles). It has incredible soaring aromatics – juniper, thyme and violet – and deep, dark fruit. Real depth and concentration here, amazing freshness, velvet texture and very long. Delicacy, power and beauty, all in balance. 2022-2040

M. Chapoutier Hermitage Le Pavillon

100% Syrah, FAR £1,350.00

4 hectare plot of 65-year-old vines on granite lieu-dit Les Bessards. 100% destemmed. 18 months in fûts, 30% new. Generous veneer of oak on the wine at the time of tasting, but there is copious fruit underneath. Very full-bodied, very dry and herbal. Straight and well balanced with muscular tannins and soaring fruit. This has the unmistakable shape and regal disposition of a serious Hermitage. Very long finish. 2022-2032

Domaine JL Chave Hermitage

100% Syrah, C&B, £1,775.40 (2012)

10% new oak. “Un été de pluie” is how Jean-Louis described the 2014 – a problem for many winemakers, but less so with vineyards on the slopes. He admits the year was “not easy” but a tasting of the various parcels shows a decent vintage in these experienced hands. It will be ready before the 2010 and the 2013 I suspect as it doesn’t quite have the density of fruit and tannin of these vintages, but it will provide plenty of pleasure and glide on through the years thanks to vibrant acidity and overall balance. 2024-2040

E. Guigal Hermitage Ex Voto

100% Syrah, FRW £1,806.00 (2007)

40% Bessards, 40% Greffieux, 10% Hermite, 10% Murands. 40 to 90-year-old vines, 42 months in new oak (so will be on the market 2018). Wide, regal and intense, shot through with ripe, firm tannin – this is a solid success for Guigal in 2014. Dense, mineral with that unmistakable Hermitage majesty. It has a robust structure but relatively lean, straight fruit expression. Pretty epic. 2022-2040

Domaine JP&C Jamet Côte-Rôtie

100% Syrah, FRW £717.00 (2012)

“Finesse, but not without concentration” is how Jean-Paul referred to the 2014s. We tasted a number of component parts from across his blends of 16 different parcels. Rather than bottling single parcels he prefers to blend, and keeps new oak to a minimum (10-15%). The overall impression is a fragrant, floral, peppery style with good aromatic definition and adequate concentration for medium-term ageing. It will be ready relatively early, and despite not being a terribly weighty vintage, its elegance and balance will provide much pleasure. 2020-2030

Domaine Vincent Paris Cornas La Geynale

100% Syrah, 13.0%, UNC £290.00 (2013)

Incredible nose of wild herbs, camphor, raspberry, balsamic fruits, plum sauce. You name it. Powerful and intensely concentrated, but not heavy, totally fresh and alive. It breathes. So fresh, so powerful, it's a force of nature. Never disappoints. 5,000 bottles made. 2020-2040

E. Guigal Côte-Rôtie La Landonne

100% Syrah, FRW £1,945.00 (2011)

No destemming for this 100% Syrah plot planted in 1975. 42 months in new oak (so will be on the market 2018). Noticeable hint of stalks on the nose that will add complexity in the long term. A robust style, very dry and intense, straight and concentrated. Deep and brooding with considerable tannic structure. Very long. 2022-2035

Domaine Benjamin & David Duclaux Côte-Rôtie Maison Rouge

100% Syrah, 13.0%, VTS £475.40 (2012)

Intensely tightly wound at this stage, with a savoury, almost earthy nose inlaid with woodspice. Very full and powerful, but not without a sense of freshness, this is a serious wine that will take some time to come round, but the balance and quality of the tannins recommends it. If you can wait. Very long finish. 4,000 bottles. 2022-2030

Domaine Bernard Faurie Hermitage Bessards-Méal

100% Syrah, UNC £450.00 (2013)

60% Bessards, 40% Méal. Similarly elegant and compact like the Greffieux-Bessards, but this is slightly more intense in fruit and structure, with some smoky, meaty hints among the fruit. Very fine and elegant, with more of a tannic frame and darker fruit than his other cuvée, so to be broached a little later, but will last longer. 2018-2035

Domaine Clape Cornas

100% Syrah, YAP £625.40 (2011)

No destemming as the stems add “another dimension” to the wine according to Olivier Clape. Fermented in concrete, aged in large old oak barrels. A tasting of the four main component parts (La Petite Côte, Sabarotte, La Côte and Reynards) shows that this is a dry, savoury vintage, with a degree of austerity. The overall impression is of a lighter vintage, but not one without balance, complexity and interest. It won't be a very long lasting one, but that's not always such a bad thing – it will be ready sooner. 2020-2030

Delas Hermitage Les Bessards

100% Syrah, FRW £1,002.00 (2013)

Ebullient and intense with joyfully hedonistic fruit that takes centre stage due to measured oak (just 30% new, 18 months) and total destemming. Mouthcoating fruit and fine tannins with lovely bright acidity and a mineral core. Long finish. Very Hermitage, very straight in structure but expansive in fruit. A success. 2022-2032

Domaine Clusel-Roch Côte-Rôtie La Viallière

100% Syrah, 12.5%, GDH £450.00

50% destalked, natural yeasts, aged for two years in barriques, 20% new. Very fine enticing aromatics already; bay leaf, loganberry, black cherry and violet. Medium- to full-bodied, with exceptionally fine tannins and a lovely beam of redcurrant acidity shining through it. Very fine, wet clay tannins and a long finish. Very well done indeed. Perfectly balanced. It sings. 2,500 bottles. 2017-2028

E. Guigal Côte-Rôtie La Mouline

93% Syrah, 7% Viognier, BDI £1,850.00 (2011)

42 months in new oak barriques (so will be on the market 2018). This is elegant and subtle in style with detailed aromatics of plum and cherry blossom. Very fresh, lively and graceful with a long finish. It won't be as long lived as some vintages, but will deliver plenty of pleasure. 2018-2030

Delas Côte-Rôtie La Landonne

100% Syrah, FRW £1,183.00 (2013)

18 months in fûts, 40% new. The oak is dominating the dark berry fruits and wild herbs for now, but this is lively and dynamic on the palate, remarkably mineral and expressive even at this stage. It's balanced, long and appetising. Exceptionally fine and discretely powerful. 2018-2028

Domaine Bernard Faurie Hermitage Greffieux-Bessards

100% Syrah, BBR £408.00 (2013)

60% Bessards, 40% Greffieux lieux-dits. Bright, fresh, pure, clean and detailed nose of raspberry, wild strawberry and plum. On the palate it's considerably more subtle and slight in frame compared to many other Hermitages. But this is one of the hallmarks of Faurie's wines; they are intentionally lighter in structure and extraction than most of his neighbours. It has fresh, zingy, crunchy fruit and the overall impression is one of sublime elegance. A very Burgundian style. So much for his plans to retire after 2015 – Bernard's not going anywhere. Rejoice! 2017-2030

Domaine Marc Sorrel Hermitage Le Gréal

100% Syrah, UNC £800.00 (2013)

Blend of lieux-dits Les Greffieux and Le Méal (hence the name). Lovely violet and black pepper nose bolstered by use of whole clusters. Fresh, clean fruit, slightly diminutive in structure compared to an average vintage of this cuvée, but more importantly the balance is good. Close-grained tannins and real finesse. 2020-2030

Paul Jaboulet Aîné Hermitage La Chapelle

100% Syrah, FRW £939.00 (2013)

Deep, brooding and intense with smoked meats on the nose. The oak is present but not overdone. Intense fruit on the palate and very straight in style. Quite hedonistic ripe-fruited style which closes with a very long finish and serious structured tannic weight. 2020-2030

Domaine du Colombier Hermitage

100% Syrah, 13.5%, J&B £375.00

Soy on the nose along with liquorice and roasted herbs. Lovely texture, intense fruit, and all very well balanced.
